
Student Getting Started Guide

Elsevier's **Clinical Practice Readiness Assessment or CPRA** is the first standardized, reliable, and online method for you to assess your nursing practice readiness. Through high-fidelity, screen-based simulations that include questions in the style of the Next Generation NCLEX, you will understand whether you have the knowledge and skills needed to succeed as a new nurse in clinical practice.

Below is your student checklist for ensuring you have the smoothest experience on Test Day.

At least 2 weeks ahead of Test Day, please ensure:

- ✓ Make sure your computer is up to date with the <u>recommended system specifications</u>, including the latest version of the Microsoft Edge (if using Windows) or Apple Safari (if using macOS) web browser.
- ✓ You have an active Evolve Account by going to evolve.elsevier.com. Before creating a new account, make sure you do not already have an existing account.
- ✓ Use the Evolve Course ID provided by your school to enroll in your Clinical Practice Readiness Assessment Course. We recommend completing this step no later than 2 weeks ahead of your scheduled Test Day.
- ✓ If testing on your own device, make sure you have installed the Elsevier Secure Browser ahead of Test Day.

On Test Day, please:

- \checkmark On Test Day you will launch this Elsevier Secure Browser to access your assessment.
- ✓ It will take you to evolve.elsevier.com to sign in and access your CPRA via Evolve.
- ✓ On test day, ensure you have all apps not needed for testing closed, and you are not screen sharing or trying to use multiple monitors or devices.
- ✓ Bring your Power Cord if testing on your own device.
- ✓ Bring Headphones so you can hear the medical grade sounds in the assessment.
- ✓ Bring a calculator, but if you do not have one, there is also one available within the assessment.
