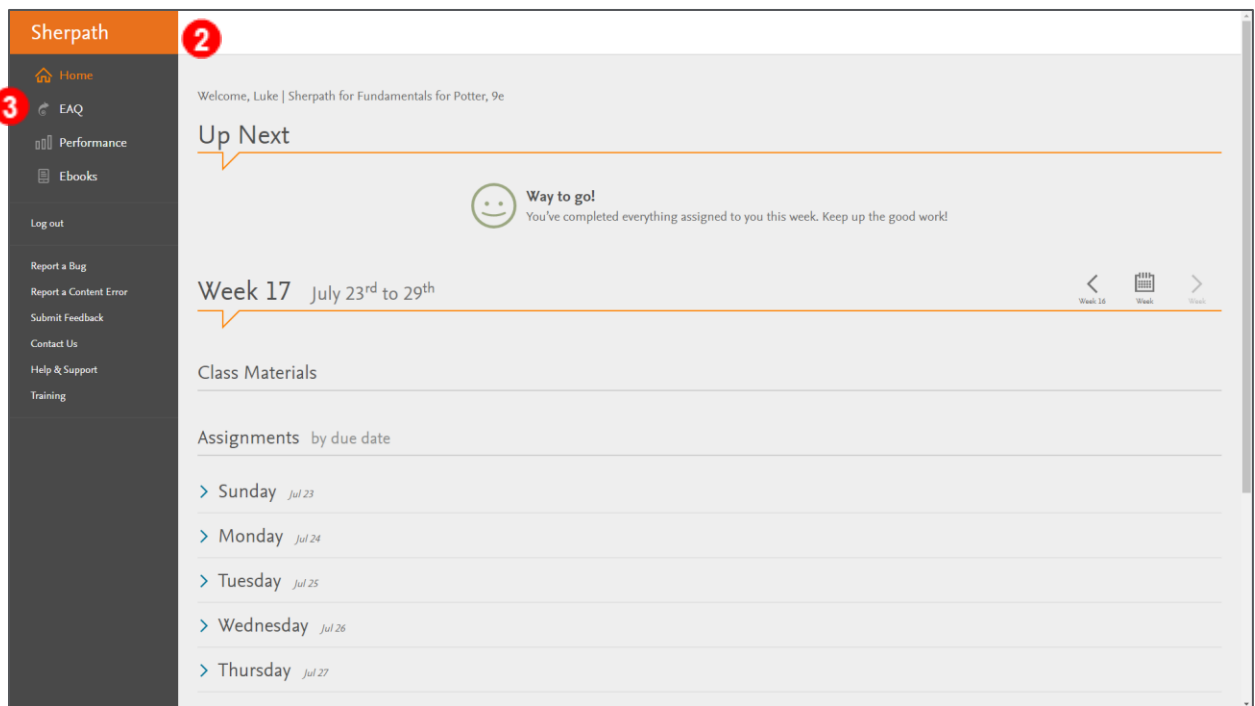


Sherpath Student View: Creating Your Own EAQ Custom Quiz

Creating Your Own EAQ Custom Quiz

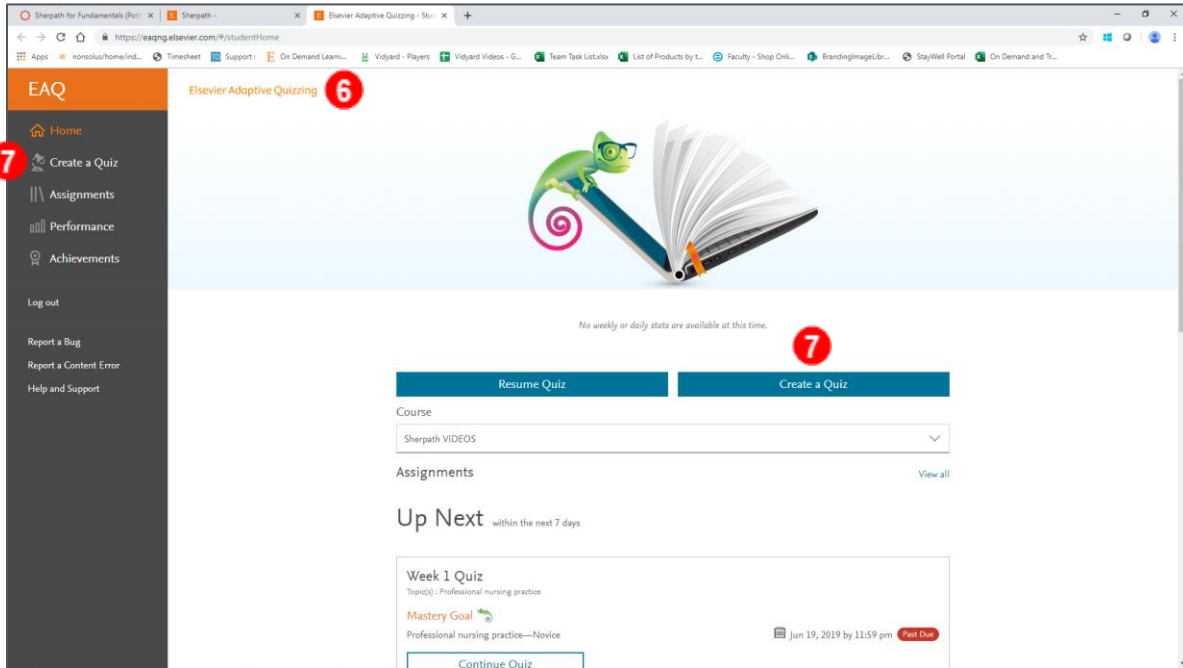
1. To get started, click on the link to Sherpath within your course.
2. The **Home** page appears.
3. Click on the EAQ tab in the upper-left corner of the screen.



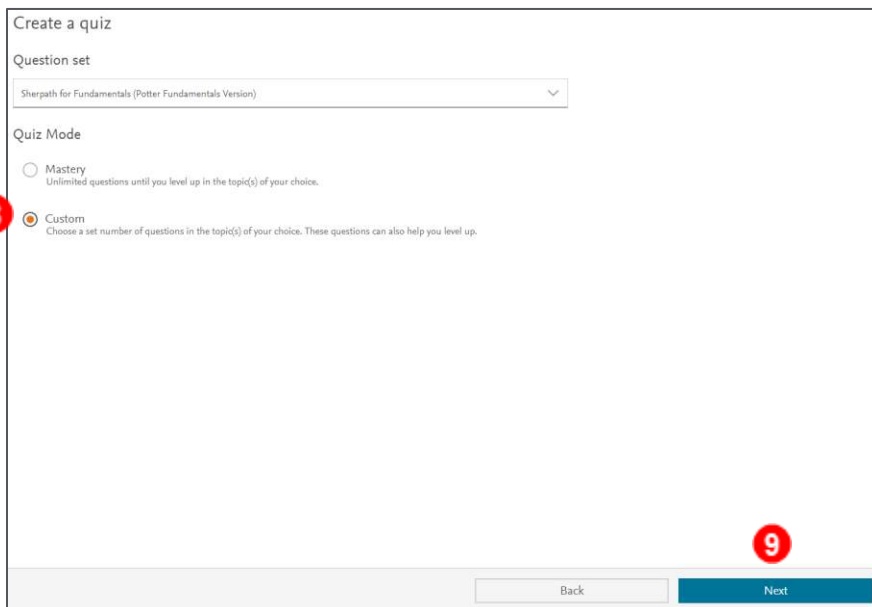
4. Note that the EAQ Home page will automatically open in a separate browser window.
5. If you want to go back to Sherpath, just click on the Sherpath tab in the browser



6. The EAQ Home page displays various types of information on it.
7. To create an EAQ quiz, click on **Click a Quiz**. This button is located both in the center of the page and in the tabs section located in the upper-left.

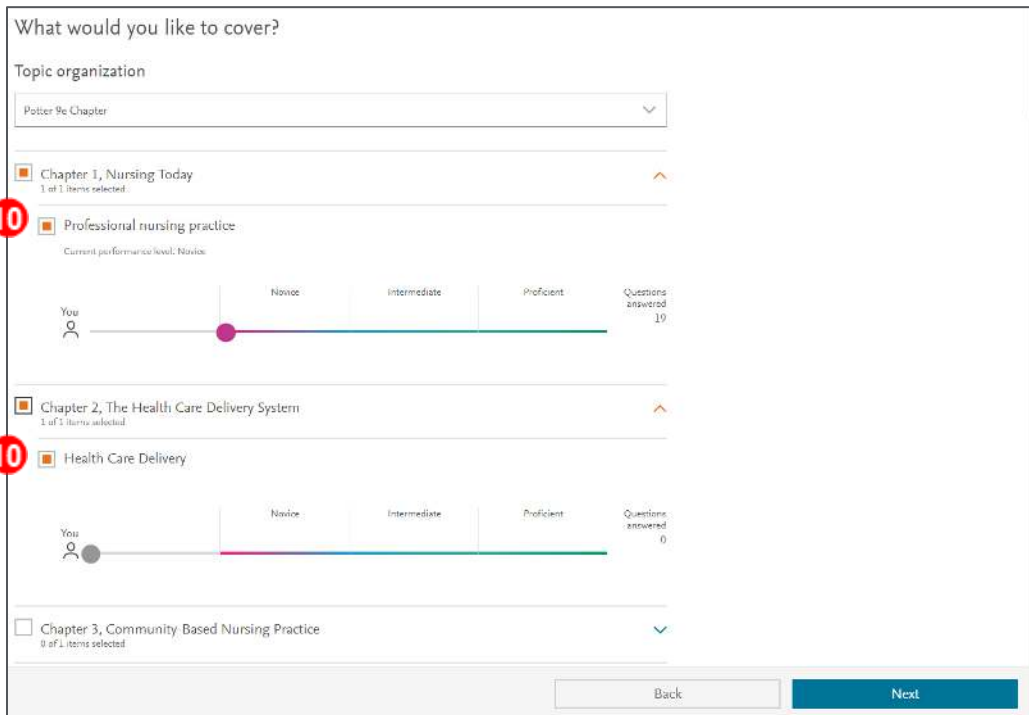


8. On this page, choose **Mastery** for your Quiz Mode. The Question Set is automatically fixed to the current Sherpath course you are quizzing yourself in.
9. Click **Next** to continue.

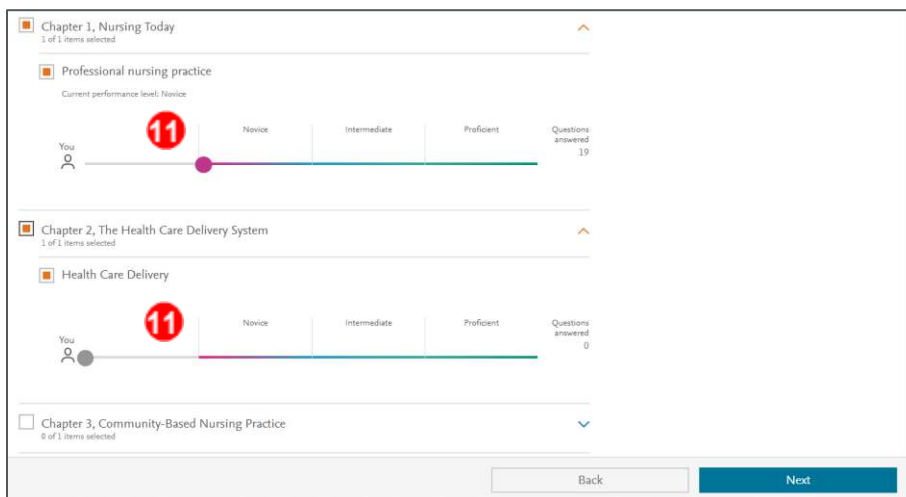


10. Topic Organization is set to the current edition of that course. For Custom quizzes, you choose one or multiple topics per quiz. The topics are organized by chapters within your Sherpath course. Choose any of the topics you want to quiz yourself on by selecting the square boxes next to them.

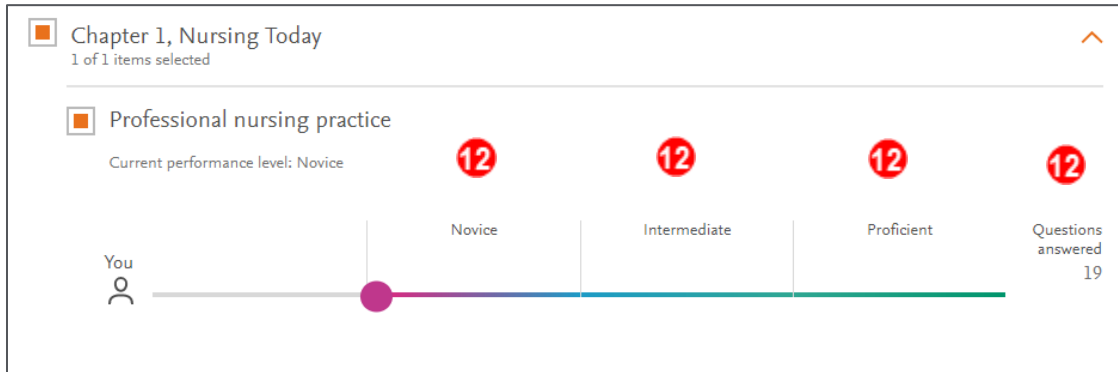
NOTE: Selecting the square box for a chapter will select all topics within that chapter.



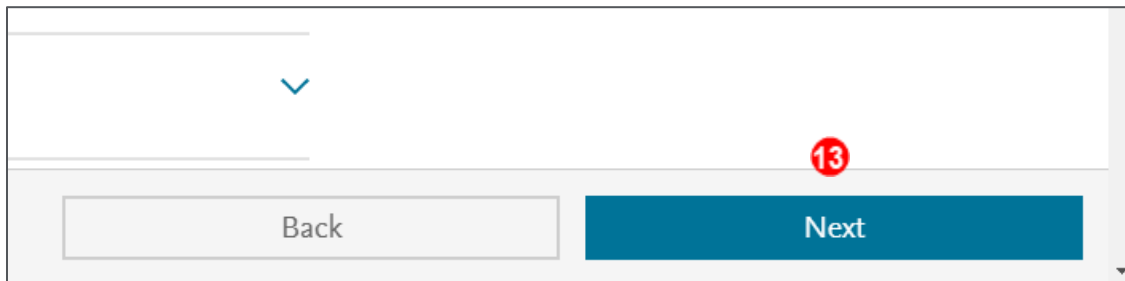
11. Located underneath each topic is your mastery of that particular topic.



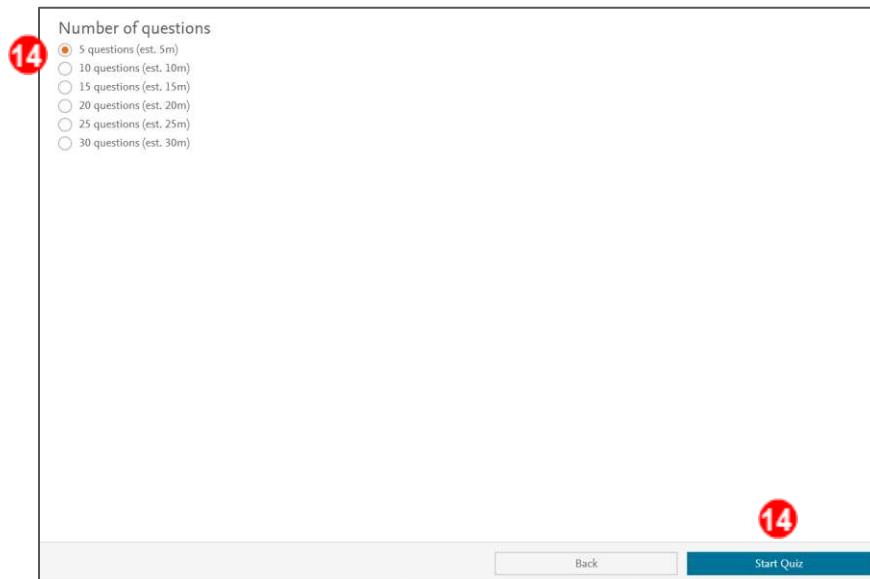
12. There are 3 mastery levels: Novice, Intermediate, and Proficient. You will also see how many questions you have answered within that topic.



13. Click **Next** to continue.



14. In Custom quizzes, you are able to set the number of questions you will have to answer. It will also show you the estimated time based on the number of questions. Click **Start Quiz** at the bottom-right of the screen.



15. Custom quizzes are not timed. You can see your progression at the top of the page. Click the answer(s) you want to submit and then click **Confident** or **Not Sure**.

Question 1

An elderly patient has been put on a potentially toxic drug for treatment of arthritis. The patient and family have expressed concern about the drug. What is the role of the nurse in this particular situation?

Rationale

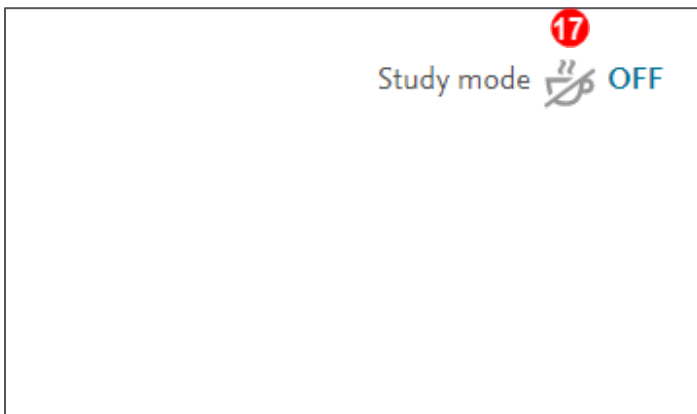
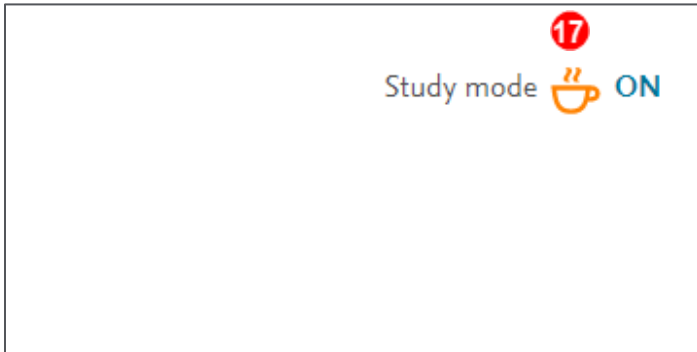
The patient has been put on a potentially toxic drug. Because the patient is elderly, the nurse should act as an advocate and take measures to protect the patient's rights. Therefore, the nurse may provide information that will help the patient decide whether to take the treatment. The nurse should not give the drug in a low dose, because that may not serve the purpose of administering it. The nurse should obey the instructions by the health care providers only after ensuring that the patient's concerns are addressed. At times, in order to protect human rights, the nurse needs to speak out against policies.

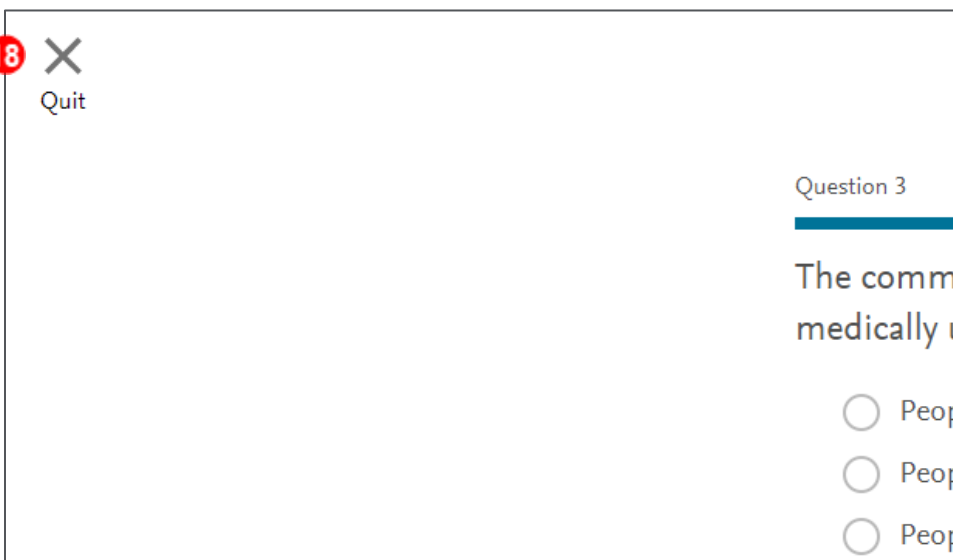

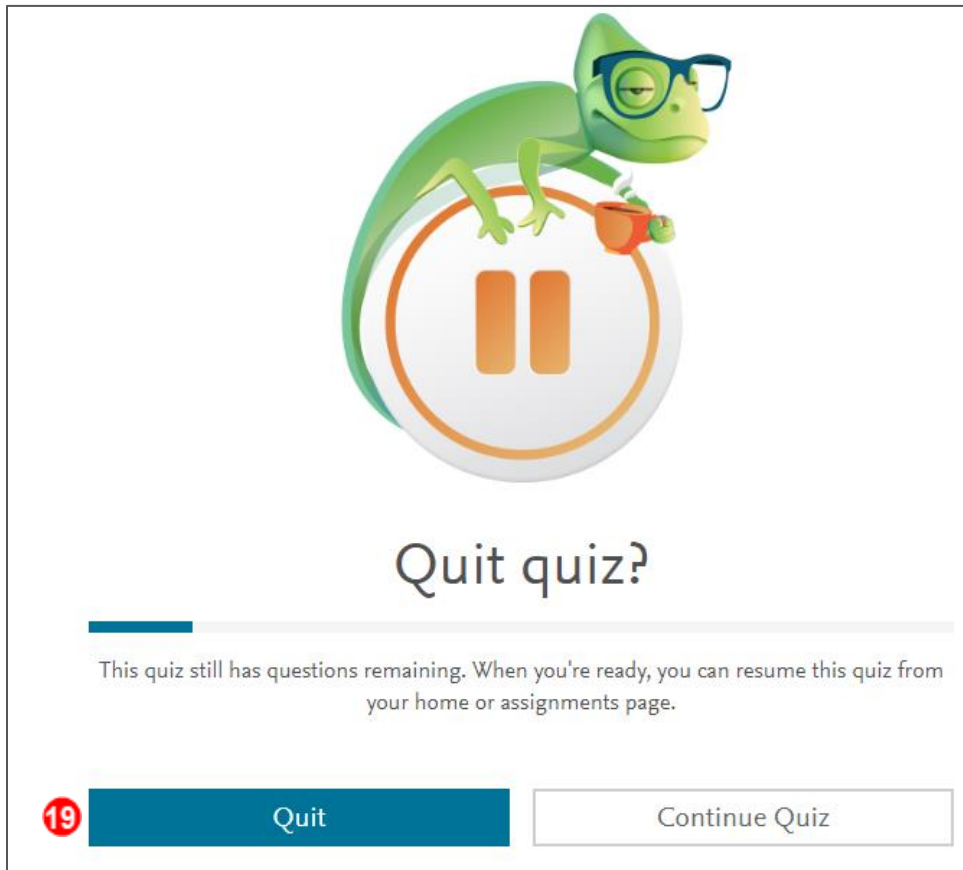

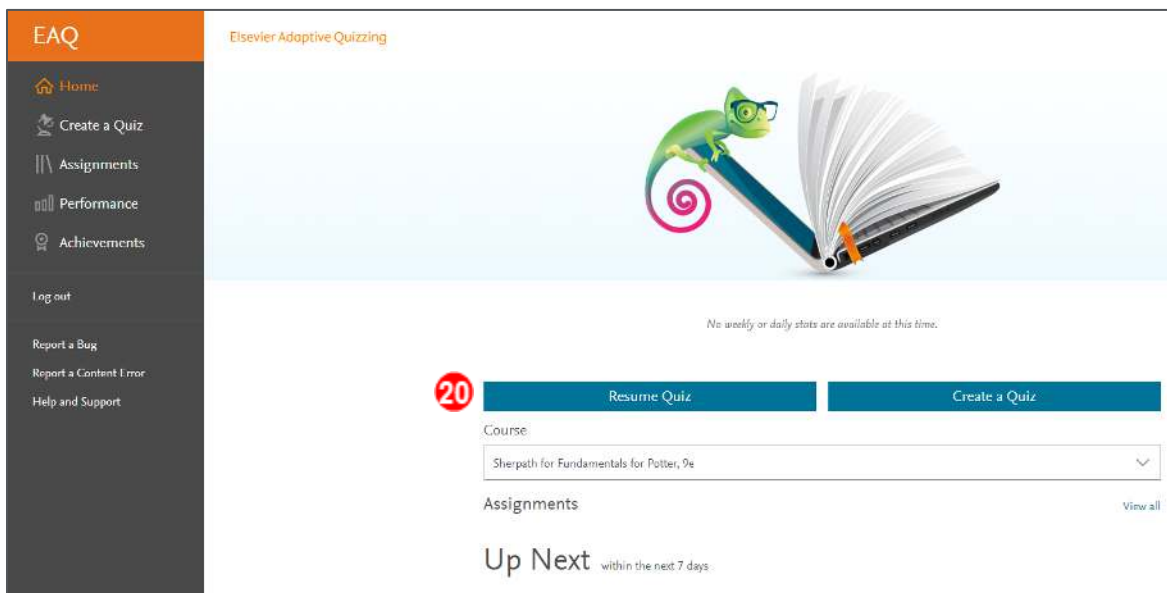
18. At any point during the quiz, you can click **Quit** in the upper-left corner of the screen.




19. Then, click **Quit** again and you will be taken back to the EAQ Home page.

21. Once you have answered all the questions, your score will appear. Mastery quizzes are Pass/Fail. Click Continue.



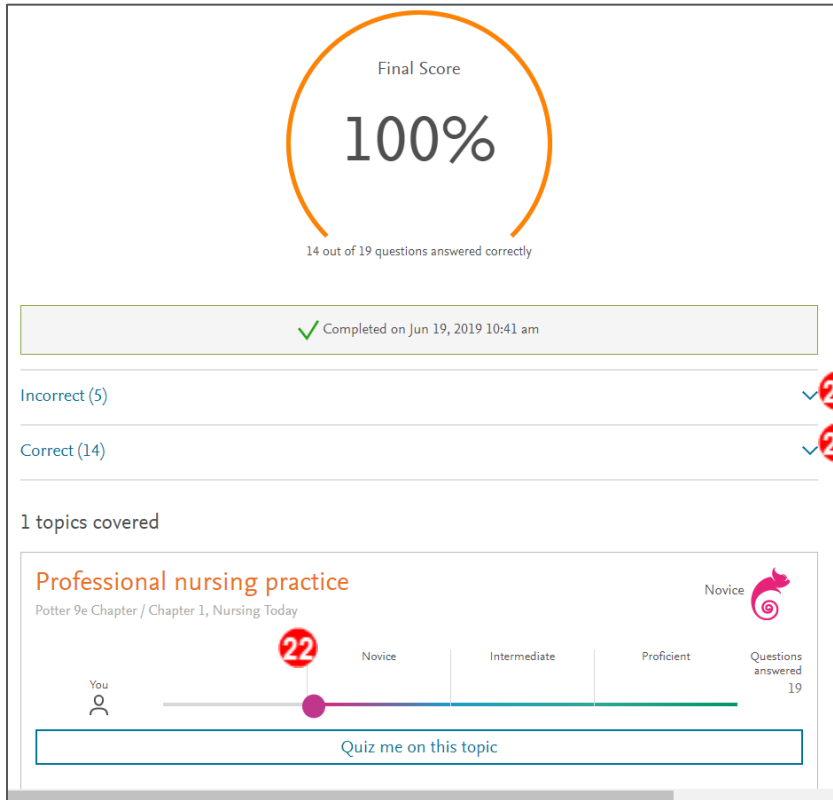

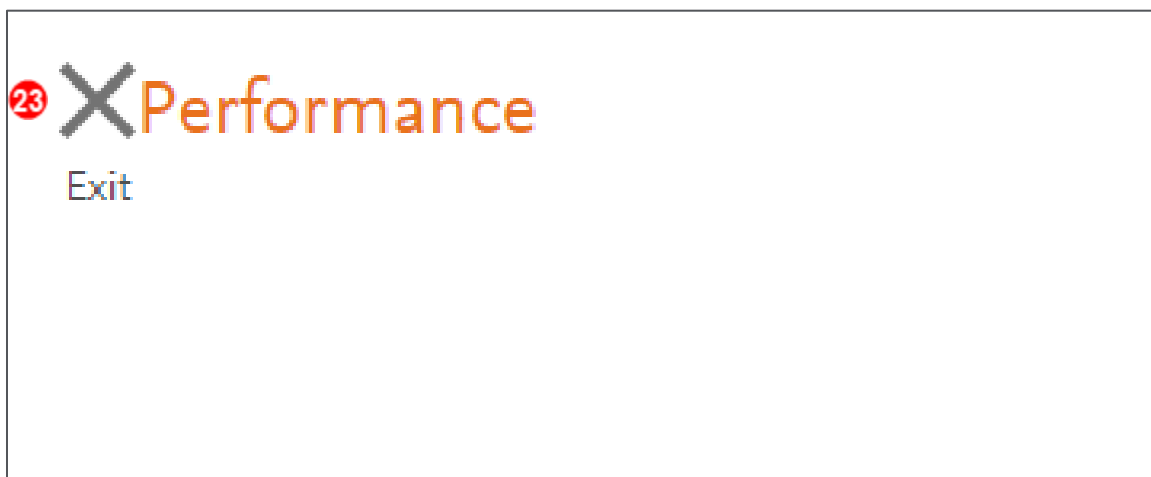
