


# HESI Next Generation: Student Remediation


## Student Remediation

1. To access your HESI Next Generation remediation, click the **Remediation** link in the right column inside your HESI NG course.

7. Each case study starts with a meet the client section. This will explain a little of the patient’s background and situation before the case study begins. You will also see an Important to know section that explains how the case studies are graded. Click **Next Section** at the bottom of the page to move forward.

Question 3 of 24

Which is the **most** important action for the nurse to perform when assessing bowel sounds? (Select all that apply.)

- Ask the client if she has lost or gained any weight.  
This provides useful information, but it is not specific to the assessment of bowel function.

- Listen for up to 5 minutes when auscultating for bowel sounds.  
The nurse must listen for up to 5 minutes before determining what type of bowel sounds are present.

- Perform a rectal exam.
- Inspect the client's abdomen while she is in a semi-Fowler's position.
- Begin auscultation in the right lower quadrant.  
The nurse should auscultate in the right lower quadrant, and then proceed to the other quadrants.

Question 4 of 24

The nurse auscultates for the client's bowel sounds and hears faint gurgling after 3 minutes. Which assessment finding should the nurse document?

- Hypoactive bowel sounds.  
Normally, bowel sounds are heard 5 to 35 times per minute. When bowel sounds are heard only after listening for 3 minutes, they are recorded as hypoactive.

- Normal bowel sounds.  
Normal bowel activity results in bowel sounds that can be heard 5 to 35 times per minute.

- Paralytic ileus.  
This refers to a condition in which there is an absence of bowel sounds.

- Reduced peristalsis.  
Although diminished bowel sounds reflect reduced peristalsis, documentation should describe what the nurse heard or assessed, rather than the probable cause.
